ARAVIND PAYS HOMAGE TO DR. CARL KUPFER



We sadly announce the demise of Dr. Carl Kupfer on the morning of 7th April 2011 at the age of 83.

Dr. Carl Kupfer was the first director of National Eye Institute, Bethesda, USA. He stepped down from his position as director on July 15, 2000 at 72 years of age. Upon his retirement Dr. Kupfer said, "As a scientist, clinician, and administrator, I have been wonderfully blessed with experiences that have brought me to the cutting edge of vision research. One of my most satisfying achievements has been helping to shape the direction of this research during the past 30 years".

Through his championing of controlled clinical trials, Dr. Kupfer has left a lasting legacy of successes in ameliorating vision loss from a number of major eye diseases, including diabetic retinopathy, glaucoma and retinopathy of prematurity.

He sowed the seeds of research at Aravind, developed our capacity and it is that which has led us to the establishment of Dr. G. Venkataswamy Eye Research Institute.

"The coming together of quality eye care, exceptional teaching opportunities and strong research capability will continue to be an inspiration for all who have been a small part of the first twenty – five years and for those yet to experience the Aravind miracle". - Dr. Carl Kupfer

CASE STUDY

Aravind's eye camp gives new hope and averts two suicides!

Here is a different story in which badly impaired vision of a grand-daughter drove her and her grand mother to the extent of deciding to commit suicide. As in the previous case, Aravind's eye camp helps the concerned girl to regain clear vision. The resultant new hope sweeps out thoughts of suicide from the minds of the grand-daughter and grandmother.

Vanitha (real name shielded) belongs to a village in Madurai district. Her parents were killed in a road accident when she was one year old. Hence she was brought up by her grandmother. Due to financial reasons she could not be educated beyond elementary school level. After she grew up, she started to work as a coolie in construction works to earn livelyhood since her grandmother had stopped going to work due to ill health.

One day, when vanitha was engaged in lifting bricks at a construction site, a brick accidentally fell on her face hitting both eyes. As it caused no visible injuries, she did not seek medical treatment. The pain in the eye area disappeared within a few days. As times passed, her eye sight began to diminish to the extent that she could not work.

Without income, the grand-daughter and her grandmother had to languish in hunger. So, they decided to commit suicide. However, before they executed their decision, Vanitha came to hear an oral advertisement about the free eye camp to be conducted by Aravind Eye Hospital in the near by town. This anouncement gave Vanitha a new hope. She informed her grandmother about the eye camp and asked "why not we go to the camp and test my eyes?". The grandma agreed.

At the eye camp, Vanitha's eyes were examined and doctors found cataract in both the eyes. The patient was informed about it and told that it should be operated upon for regaining clear vision. Vanitha agreed. She was brought to Aravind-Madurai and both her eyes were operated one after another with a few days interval. The operations were successful. When she regained clear vision, Vanitha felt very happy. It gave her a new hope that she could again go to work and earn to feed her grandmother. As a result thoughts of suicide disappeared from both of their minds.

Before leaving the hospital, the old woman thanked Aravind and the doctors for restoring the vision of her grand-daughter and thus averted the impending tragedy of double suicide!
