World Glaucoma Week 2012

March 11- 17

World Glaucoma Week is observed every year from March 11 - 17 to enhance awareness about glaucoma among the public and the healthcare providers in general so that it generates efforts to screen the individuals at risk at periodic intervals to detect glaucoma early to enable appropriate intervention and prevent needless blindness.

Aravind – Tirunelveli

Various awareness programmes were organized by Aravind – Tirunelveli on the occasion of World Glaucoma Week. An exhibition with details on glaucoma was arranged at the hospital. Glaucoma detection camps were organized at Kadayanallur and Kallidaikurichi vision centres. A total of 180 patients were screened at Kadayanallur Vision Centre. 25 patients were diagnosed with glaucoma out of which 9 were newly identified patients. A total of 139 patients were screened at Kallidaikurichi and 19 patients were identified as glaucoma patients. 17 new glaucoma patients were identified. An interactive session and seminar on glaucoma was arranged under the leadership of Dr. R.

Ramakrishnan on March 16. All India Radio, Tuticorin and All India Radio, Tirunelveli broadcast the talk of Dr.R.Ramakrishnan on glaucoma on February 10.

Banners were displayed; pamphlets and notices were distributed to create awareness among the public on glaucoma. An awareness programme on glaucoma was telecast on Hello FM 7 times per day for a week.

Aravind – Pondicherry



An awareness exhibition on glaucoma was organized at Gandhi Tidal, near Pondicherry beach on March 11. Around 450 persons visited the exhibition and got benefitted. A one week awareness exhibition was conducted at Aravind Eye Hospital, Pondicherry during March 11- 17. A quiz programme was arranged for the patients after the exhibition visit and prizes were distributed immediately. Glaucoma awareness posters were displayed at many places in the city. Glaucoma awareness advertisement was broadcast on the Suriyan FM. A special

glaucoma screening camp was organized for the staff of Electricity Department on March 14and 220 employees participated in the same. Five persons were identified as having glaucoma in the camp. A screening camp for those glaucoma patients who missed their regular follow up and their family members was arranged at the city centre on March 16. 126 patients attended the camp. At another screening camp held at Chengam on March 17, 125 patients participated and 7 were identified as glaucoma patients and were referred to base hospital.

Aravind – Madurai



A glaucoma screening camp was held in the hospital premises for siblings, parents and children of individuals detected to have glaucoma in the base hospital during the past one year. Around 300 patients were screened, out of which 249 individuals were new outpatients and closely related to individuals with glaucoma. Fifty persons with definite glaucoma or suspect glaucoma were identified and further referred for investigations.

An awareness talk was delivered by Dr. Sharmila on the All India Radio and she was also interviewed on Radio Mirchi on the significance of Glaucoma week observations. Dr.S.R. Krishnadas was interviewed by World BBC Tamil Radio on the importance of early detection of

glaucoma and prevention of glaucoma blindness.


