Women's Day Celebrations

March 8

World Glaucoma Week Celebrations

March 8-13

Aravind Eye Hospital, Pondicherry conducted various awareness programmes in and around the city. A mega marathon was organized which was inaugurated by Thiru Dr. S. Sundaravadivelu, Special Secretary to Govt-cum-District Collector, Govt. of Puducherry. Dr. R. Venkatesh, Chief Medical Officer of Aravind Pondicherry addressed the press meet. More than 1,300 students and public participated in the event. The marathon covered main streets of Pondicherry city.

Aravind – Salem organized Glaucoma Awareness Run (5KM) at Gandhi Stadium, Salem. A total of 470 participants participated to fight blindness due to Glaucoma. The event was inaugurated by Sri. Amalraj IPS, City Police Commissioner– Salem. Top 10 finishers in each category were given prizes, medals and Certificates.



Aravind – Tirunelveli organized exclusive Glaucoma camps at Kadayam and Pavoorchatram vision centres. A total of 138 patients were screened at Kadayam. 31 patients were identified to have of which 20 were newly identified cases. A total of 90 patients were screened at Pavoorchatram. 10 patients were found to have Glaucoma of which 8 were newly identified cases.

The hospital joined hands with the Ophthalmology department at Tirunelveli Medical College Hospital in organising glaucoma mega

awareness walk from VOC ground – Palayamkottai till the Medical College Hospital. The walk was inaugurated by Tirunelveli Medical college Dean Dr. Thulasiram in the presence of Dr. R. Ramakrishnan, Chief Medical Officer, Aravind Eye Hospital, Tirunelveli and Dr. Yoheswari, Head of the Department, Ophthalmology department, Tirunelveli Medical College. More than 400 members participated in the walk. Press meet also was arranged. Leaflets were distributed to public during the walk. An awareness exhibition for Patients and public was arranged for the public which was inaugurated by Dr. P. Vijayalakshmi Chief - Paediatric Ophthalmology Services, Madurai. The exhibition displayed different types of glaucoma with the help of various models and pictures. Dr. R. Ramakrishnan gave glaucoma awareness talk on Hello FM and All India radio. Awareness seminar for patients and their attenders was conducted in the hospital auditorium.
