Editorial

Over the years, Aravind has built good will and trust amongst patients coming from bordering districts of Andhra Pradesh. A number of patients from southern part of the state have been visiting Aravind Eye Hospitals to avail quality eye treatment and this is increasing year after year. Several years ago, what used to be a small number of patients, has now steadily increased to over a 150 patients every day with about 50 of them getting operated. Most of these patients come to Aravind for speciality eye surgeries which are complex and are provided at reasonable charges or at subsidised cost for those who belong to poor socioeconomic groups. Many of them have to come for several review visits following surgery and the cost involved in the travel makes the entire treatment cycle expensive for many. Recognizing these hardships, Aravind finally established a hospital closer to their homes, in Tirupati with the support of Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams, who allocated the land at a nominal lease.

Since more than 80% of Aravind's work-force is constituted by women, International Women's Day was celebrated with a wide variety of programmes. It is also important to note several senior lady doctors received awards from various forums on this occasion.

World Glaucoma Week was observed with great fervour. Glaucoma being the silent thief of sight, the need to have regular eye examination and compliance to treatment were stressed during the awareness creation programmes.

Tirupati, March 04



Compassionate world-class eye care at an affordable cost, has come to serve at Tirupati with the formal inauguration of Sri Venkateswara Aravind Eye Hospital by Shri Chandrababu Naidu Garu, Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh. The hospital has been providing outpatient services since December 2018. Senior leadership team of Aravind, prominent leaders in the community, officials from Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams, managers and staff were present during the inauguration. The 2.7 Lakh sq.ft hospital facility has the capacity to handle 4 lakh outpatients and perform about 30,000 eye surgeries per year. Like any other Aravind centre, the hospital will have 50% of the services as paying and 50 % as either free or at deeply subsidised rate.
