Inauguration of Topcon Project, Vision for All

Aravind - Theni, July 10



Aravind – Theni initiated the Vision for All project supported by Topcon and Mehra Eye Tech. The project aims to provide comprehensive eye care services to eliminate needless blindness in Theni District and develop it as the best eye care zone in the state of Tamil Nadu. Objectives include reduction of prevalence of avoidable vision impairment, major causes being diabetic retinopathy, glaucoma and uncorrected refractive errors. It also aims to work with government health facilities through a mode of public-private partnership for providing eye care services. The target areas include Aravind's primary eye care centres, community eye clinics, eye hospitals, diabetes

centres, NGOs, government primary health centres and private schools.

At the inauguration, Dr. P. Namperumalsamy gave a brief about the project. Dr. Kathirkanu, Dean, Theni Govt. Medical College, Dr. R. Thaigarajan, Secretary – IMA, offered felicitations. Dr. T. Kanchana, Deputy Director, Health Services, Theni delivered the special address. Dr. Ravi Mehra, Managing Director, Mehra Eye Tech, Pvt. Ltd flagged of the mobile van.
