Editorial

In the last year, Aravind Eye Hospitals have examined over 45,000 outpatients from Andhra Pradesh, and over 17,000 patients underwent surgeries, with over 70% of them receiving high quality eye care at steeply subsidized rates or free of cost. Most of these patients come to Aravind for speciality eye surgeries which are complex and are provided at reasonable charges or at subsidised cost for those who belong to poor socioeconomic groups. Many of them have to come for several review visits following surgery and the cost involved in the travel makes the entire treatment cycle expensive for many. Recognizing the hardships that these patients have to face to access the hospital, Aravind was very keen to establish a hospital closer to their homes, in one of the bordering districts of Andhra Pradesh. With support from Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams, the dream is being materialised now as the foundation stone was laid for Sri Venkateswara Aravind Eye Hospital in Tirupati.

Retinoblastoma is the eye cancer that affects children less than seven years of age. While the disease by itself is serious in nature, timely diagnosis, appropriate treatment and regular follow-up can save vision and lives of children. On the occasion of World Retinoblastoma Awareness week, Aravind centres at Madurai and Coimbatore organized a meet of disease survivors, which turned out to be an emotional and motivating event.


Continuing the mission of making eye care easily accessible even to the rural masses, Aravind opened vision centre at Palladam, thus taking the total number of centres to 63.

Aravind – Madurai, May 20


