Editorial

April is always a busy month at Aravind and this year too it was no exception. Everywhere in the hospital it was the sight of patients streaming in and staff stretching out themselves to ensure the smooth patient flow and to cater to their needs. One of the reasons why patients prefer Aravind to other eye care centres is the unique culture and value system that the staff follow, which has been ingrained in them right from the inception of the organisation. A retreat was held in the last week of April to demystify this unique Aravind culture and to identify the various rough edges that we come across while practising these.

Sub Saharan Africa (SSA) is one of the regions with higher prevalence of blindness due to cataract with more than 1.5 million losing their sight. The CSR in the region is around 200 to 400 for a million and WHO fixed the goal as 2000-3000 for a million. In order to increase the cataract surgical services in SSA, Hilton Foundation, LAICO and Dana Centre for Preventive Ophthalmology (Johns Hopkins University) joined hands together to develop model eye care centres that can be replicated in the region. The first phase started in 2013 and ended in 2016 Hilton Foundation was generous to come forward to support these hospitals for another three years.

In order to make eye care easily accessible to the rural people, Aravind opened its 62nd vision centre in Kalugumalai.

LAICO HAPPENINGS

Strategic Planning Workshop for Participant Hospitals of Hilton Cataract Initiative

LAICO, April 21-26



In order to increase the cataract surgical services in sub-Saharan Africa, Hilton Foundation, LAICO - Aravind Eye Care System and Dana Centre for Preventive Ophthalmology (Johns Hopkins University) joined hands together to develop model eye care centres that can be replicated in SSA. Five entrepreneurial ophthalmologists were identified to participate in this noble cause. The overall goal of the ACCESS (African Centres of Excellence in Cataract Surgical Services Network), supported by Hilton Foundation was to build the capacity of these five eye hospitals to perform at least 5000 cataract surgeries annually, by the end of the project period. The first phase started in 2013 and ended in 2016. The project assisted the five hospitals (from Ethiopia, Kenya, Nigeria and Zambia) through a systematic planning, staff training, implementation of systems and processes, installation of IHMS & CATQA platforms, clinical protocols, stationery, etc. In addition to this, onsite support was also provided to most of the hospitals. These hospitals could not achieve the said targets due to various challenges – low awareness levels & priority for eye care, difficulty in conducting productive outreach camps, issues with respect to quality, especially the post-op visual outcomes and affordability of the community, etc. With immense experience gained with the implementation of phase I of this initiative, hospital teams, LAICO and Dana Centre strongly felt the need for continuity of the support.

Hilton Foundation generously came forward to support the hospitals for another three years until 2020. Towards this, a strategic planning workshop was conducted at LAICO. Strategies were planned to enhance quality, increase the number of screening eye camps and their productivity with greater level of community participation.
