# **CASE STUDY**

# First surgery after the 5th walk out! But she stays back for the second!!

Hospitals occasionally receive uncooperative patients who create problems for the medical personnel. They have to be handled with patience and compassion so that they get necessary treatment. For Aravind staff and employees it is part of their work culture and they could successfully deal with a patient like Ramayee (real name shielded) who adamantly refused to undergo cataract surgery.



The aged woman had come to Aravind- Pondicherry with matured cataract in both eyes. She was guided by her husband, since she had become almost blind. During eye examination, she did not cooperate with the staff. When the husband requested Ramayee to cooperate, she became angry and pushed him aside.

However, the hospital staff without losing temper, spoke kind words to the patient and explained the need for these tests to find out the cause of her problem. She agreed. After the examinations, she was advised surgery, on the next day.

When a nurse came for taking her to the operation theatre, Ramayee refused to accompany. She insisted that her husband should also come with her. She did not listen to the nurse who was saying that no one except the patient is allowed inside

the operation theatre area.

As the old woman was conducted into the Block room after much persuasion, she saw a patient being given the anaesthetise injection. "O, no, I will have no injection"- she said adamantly. The nurses had a hard time before they gave her the block-injection. When her turn came Ramayee was asked to come to the theatre. But, she refused to undergo operation and returned to her ward-bed with the help of her husband. A nurse would go to the ward and take her back to the operation theatre. Next minute Ramyee will return to her ward. Again the nurse will bring the patient to the theatre and again the patient would return. This scene was repeated for five times.

At the 6th time the O.T. nurses succeeded in their attempt. They explained to Ramayee the importance of eye sight for leading an independent life and for taking care of her husband. And surgery is the only way to regain her lost vision. Finally, the old woman realised what the nurse said was right.

With the nurse standing nearby, cataract surgery was performed on Ramayee's right eye. When the bandage was removed she could see a bright world, which till the previous day was dark to her. Her right eye which could only "perceive light" (PL+) prior to operation was improved to the level of 6\18 after the surgery.

The joyful patient decided to have cataract surgery on her left eye also. She stayed in the hospital for 3 more days and entered the block-room with confidence. She asked the nurses to give her the anesthetic injection. Later she calmly underwent the operation! Ramayee who had come to the hospital with near blind eyes, holding her husband's hand for guidance, returned home with vision regained, after thanking Aravind and blessing all the staff.
